

## **SAHy<sup>™</sup> 2023 Retrospective Highlights**

SAHy<sup>TM</sup>, the inaugural launch of South Australia's premier Hydrogen conference, was a resounding success. The conference, which was attended by over 150 delegates, boasted fifteen industry speakers, informative panel discussions, member showcases, Hydrogen exhibitors, and networking opportunities.

Co-founded by Quentin Roberts and Nicholas Mumford, SA-H2H<sup>™</sup> aimed to bring together leaders in the hydrogen space to share ideas, learn from one another, collaborate, and drive the hydrogen movement in South Australia. The conference primarily focused on informative sessions and panel discussions that provided industry peers and researchers with an opportunity for face-to-face conversations, designed to help propel the hydrogen sector in South Australia.

Hon Tom Koutsantonis MP, Minister for Energy & Mining, and Minister for Infrastructure & Transport officially opened the conference. He spoke about the plans for building a nation-leading Hydrogen Power Plant that would harness the state's global leadership in renewable energy and seize the opportunities of green hydrogen as a fuel source for not only South Australia but also the world.

Other key speakers included Fiona Simon, CEO of the Australian Hydrogen Council; Sam Crafter, CEO of the Office of Hydrogen Power SA; and Nick Smith, Executive Director, Growth & Low Carbon Division Department for Energy and Mining. They shared their respective plans and development for the state and country.

The conference also featured an engaging panel discussion facilitated by Miranda Taylor, CEO of the National Energy Resources Australia. The panel comprised Nicholas Mumford, Co-Founder of South Australian Hydrogen Hubs Incorporated; Richard Smith, Manager of Hydrogen & Clean Fuels Development, ATCO Australia; Nick Berry, Manager Government Relations, Fortescue Future Industries; and Bettina Venner, Acting Director of Manufacturing & Supply Chain, Industry Capability Network. They discussed the challenges facing the hydrogen industry in the twenty-first century. SA-H2H<sup>™</sup> was delighted to bring together these industry spokespersons, who are helping to change the way the state moves forward in this emerging energy space.
